PROFILE

METHODIST UNIVERSITY GHANA (MUG)

The Wesleyan Mission Society which arrived in Ghana in 1835 laid the foundation for the establishment of The Methodist Church Ghana. The Church was initially affiliated to the British Methodist Church and it became autonomous in 1962. The provision of education at all levels had been a major activity by The Methodist Church Ghana, among others, over the years.

The role of Churches, including The Methodist Church Ghana, in providing Basic, Senior High Schools and Colleges of Education was scaled down in 1961, under the then education reform programme. The Government decided to be responsible for the running of mission schools and Colleges of Education. It also established many senior high/ secondary level schools, and Colleges of Education.

In the mid 1990s, Ghana had only four state Universities: University of Ghana, Kwame Nkrumah University of Science and Technology, University of Cape Coast, and University of Education, Winneba. With a growing population, access to these universities became limited.

Considerable concern was expressed about the inadequacy of institutional facilities in the state universities to cater for qualified candidates who wished to avail themselves of the opportunity for tertiary education. The Methodist Church Ghana was convinced that with her unique record and experience in the provision of education at the levels of basic, secondary and colleges for teacher education, it could make a contribution to the solution of the problems of offering education at all levels.

The Church decided at its 37th Annual Conference held in Sunyani (1998) to establish a Methodist University College. After due preparations and processes, the Methodist University College Ghana (MUCG) was granted accreditation by the National Accreditation Board (NAB) in August, 2000. Its application for affiliation to the University of Ghana was approved in October, 2002.

MUCG started academic work in October, 2000. The first batch of students reported for lectures in November, 2000 and the second batch in October, 2001.

Autonomy

On Tuesday, 30th August 2022, MUCG received Presidential Charter and therefore became an autonomous institution capable of awarding its own degrees and certificates. So the Methodist University College Ghana is now METHODIST UNIVERSITY GHANA (MUG).

The main campus of MUG is situated on a twelve (12) hectare land located to the southern end of the Wesley Grammar School compound at Dansoman, Accra. There are two other campuses at Tema and Wenchi in the Bono East.

Aims and Objectives

To realize its mission, MUG seeks to:

- provide facilities for learning, and to give instruction and training in such branches of knowledge as the University may desire to foster and, in doing so, to enable students to obtain the advantage of liberal education, bearing in mind the manpower needs of the country;

- promote by research and other means the advancement of knowledge and its practical application to social, cultural, economic, scientific and technological problems;
- develop students' ability to think critically and to develop the highest ethical and human values and excellent aesthetic taste;
- provide opportunity to qualified candidates to have University education irrespective of race, gender or religion;
- provide students with the best academic, professional and practical training including the development of the spirit of entrepreneurship and innovation;
- encourage students to appreciate the importance of hard work and dignity of labour;
- stimulate, particularly through teaching and research, interest in and appreciation of African Culture and heritage;
- encourage students to yield their lives wholly to God such that their lives reflect Christian principles, values and ethics including love of neighbor, honesty; humility and loyalty to their country.

Administration of MUG

MUG is run by the University Council. Its main operational body is the Academic Board, and the Chief Executive Officer is the Vice Chancellor of the University. The Vice Chancellor is assisted by the Pro Vice Chancellor and the Registrar.

The Registrar provides administrative support services to the Vice Chancellor, Faculties, Departments as well as standing and ad-hoc Committees. The Registrar is also the Chief Operations Officer of the University.

Faculties and Academic Programmes

MUG runs Day-Time, Evening and Weekend Programmes.

It has four Faculties, namely:

- Business Administration,

- Arts and Social Sciences,
- Science
- Education and Entrepreneurship

Faculty of Business Administration

The Faculty offers programmes of study leading to the award of the degree of Bachelor of Business Administration (BBA) in the following areas of specialization:

- Accounting
- Banking and Finance
- Human Resource Management
- Marketing
- Management Studies
- BSc. Procurement and Supply Chain Management.

It also offers *Master of Business Administration degrees (MBA) in Accounting, Finance, Human Resource Management and Marketing.*

Faculty of Arts and Social Sciences

The Faculty runs the following programmes: B.Sc. Economics, B.A. Psychology, B.A. Social Work, M.A./M.Phil. Guidance and Counseling, and B.A. Communication Studies.

In addition, the Faculty, in collaboration with the Faculty of Science and Faculty of Business Administration, offers a number of general studies courses in English, French, Mathematics, Statistics, Religious Studies, Christian Ethics, Contemporary Issues, Logic and Critical Thinking, African Studies, Behavioural Studies, Business and Professional Ethics, Entrepreneurship and Computer Studies to support and enhance all degree programmes run by the various Faculties. Students can, however, take Functional French as an

elective or subsidiary course to their main subjects of study up to the degree level.

Faculty of Science

The Faculty runs the following programmes: B.Sc. General Nursing, B.Sc. Information Technology B.Sc. Agric, Diploma in General Agric, Diploma in Information Technology and Diploma in General Nursing.

Faculty of Education and Entrepreneurship

The Faculty runs the following programmes: M.Ed. Education Leadership and Innovation, M.Ed. Education Management and Practice, and M.A. Small Business Management, M.A. Entrepreneurship, Ph.D. in Education, MPhil. Educational Leadership and School Improvement, MPhil. Educational Assessment and Evaluation, MPhil. Educational Administration, MPhil. Entrepreneurship and Corporate Strategy M.A. Educational Leadership and School Improvement, M.A. Educational Administration and Supervision, M.A. Entrepreneurship and Corporate Strategy.

Hostel Facilities

The University has a hostel (Alpha Royal Hostel) on Campus built by the Methodist Lay Movement which accommodates four hundred students. There is also an ultra-modern hostel/commercial complex, (Centre Link) on the Dansoman campus which has the capacity to accommodate 820 students.

The Wenchi campus has hostel facilities both at the main campus and the Department of Nursing campus.

Library

The University has a Library stocked with the latest books in various disciplines. It holds forty-one thousand, eight-hundred and fifty-eight (41,858) volumes and several journals and periodicals as well

as some on-line database. Its entire functions including Acquisitions, Cataloguing, Circulations and Serial Management are fully computerized besides the availability of an Open Public Catalogue (OPAC) for searching the bibliographic details of the Library. All its thirty computers are connected to 24 hour internet service. It has sitting space for some 200 users.

Funding

The major source of funding for the University is tuition fees and annual subventions from the Methodist Development Fund. MUG also receives donations in cash and kind from individuals, corporate organisations and well-wishers.

Staffing

MUG with its three Campuses in Dansoman, Tema and Wenchi currently has a total of 104 teaching staff made up of 63 full-time and 41 part-time members. Its non-teaching staff totals 144 consisting of 35 Senior Members and 109 Senior/Junior Staff.

Student Population

The total student population currently stands at 1,983 made up of 903 males and 1,080 females.

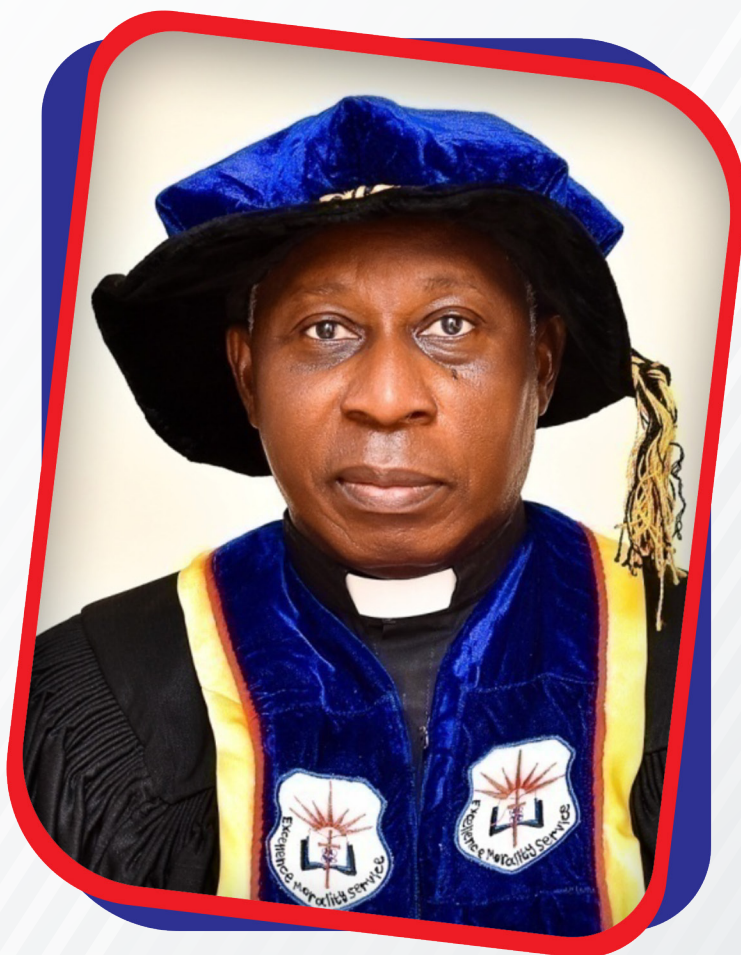
